DOG LICENSE

State Statute requires all dogs 5 months of age or older to be licensed. There are five options to purchase a dog license in Monroe County as explained on the dog license request form. If you choose Option 1, complete the application and pay by **separate check** to **TREASURER, TOWN OF RIDGEVILLE**. You must send along a current (3 year or less) rabies vaccination certificate (or photo copy) and a self-addressed **stamped** envelope. The rabies certificate along with the dog license and tag will be mailed back to you. **NOTE:** You can purchase your dog license from the Town Treasurer only until February 28th, 2022. After that date, you'll need to purchase your license from Monroe County directly.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF THIS LETTER

IMPORTANT GENERAL INFORMATION: (PLEASE READ)

- Monthly meeting for Town of Ridgeville is usually held the 2nd Monday of each month at 7:00 P.M. at the Ridgeville Town Hall in Norwalk. Occasionally conflicts arise and the date changes. Check the web site for the exact day and time. Agenda is posted at the Town Hall and on the Town web page.
- Town **Garbage Pick-Up** days are the **1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month** and must be out by the mailbox by 8:00 A.M and must be tied shut or they won't be picked up. These bags must not weigh more than 40 lbs. Town of Ridgeville garbage bags are **REQUIRED** to be used for garbage. Bags cost \$1.50 each and may be purchased at 71 Express in Norwalk, and at the Town Office or monthly Town meetings. If the Garbage Day falls on a snow day, it will not be picked up until the next day. Be sure to take your bags back in so they are not covered by snow for the next day or they may not be picked up.
- Recyclable Only – NO GARBAGE OR METAL IN THE DUMP TRAILER. Recyclables need to be brought to the Town Shop Parking Area by residents themselves and put in the dump trailer. Recyclables may be brought down on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays and also the Saturdays following the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays. Clear Bags should be used for the Recyclables. All cardboard/boxes must be tied together. All Recycling Bags must be tied shut.
- Large item Township Clean-up Days are held in the spring and the fall of each year.
- Contact the Chairman or Clerk for required building and driveway permits.
- Ridgeville Town is encouraging residents to control noxious weeds on their property. Some examples of common noxious (invasive) weeds in our area include Canada Thistle, Garlic Mustard, Wild Parsnip, and Water Hemp. - Just a reminder to all Ridgeville residents: When plowing snow for private driveways (whether you plow your own or hire it out), all snow must be pushed a minimum of 20 feet off the road pavement.
- Just a reminder that all residents are responsible for keeping their fire signs/numbers clear of debris which helps the fire department in case of an emergency.
- If you are doing controlled burns, please contact the 911 Dispatcher and notify them of the burn. This allows the Dispatcher to know that the fire department is NOT needed should a passerby happen to see the smoke and call in the fire. This also prevents you from receiving a bill from the Fire Department should they be dispatched in error.
